REVIEW OF REQUEST UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

I am writing in response to your email of July last year requesting an internal review of the Cabinet Office's handling of your request for information, under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act'), about wikileaks.org. I am sorry for not replying before now.

Your request for information, of June last year, was as follows:

Please can you take the original request and narrow the timeframe to the last 6 months. You may treat this as a clarification or a new request

The 'original request' that you referred to in your email was made in May last year (our reference: FOI265733) and was as follows:

Please supply all memos, documents and communications referencing the websites known as wikileaks.org (and international versions such as wikileaks.de).

The Cabinet Office's response to the 'original request' cited section 12 of the Act as the department estimated it would exceed the appropriate limit to comply with your request.

Our response to your refined request, the request you have requested an internal review of, confirmed that the Cabinet Office does not hold any information falling within the scope of the request.

As part of this internal review I asked officials to undertake a further search for any information relevant to your request. The result of this search was the same as the result of the search done following receipt of your request – the Cabinet Office does not hold any information within the scope of your request. Once again, I am sorry for not having responded before today.
