4. Since 1st October 2008, the number of University Services' staff who have resigned from posts with salaries greater than £60,000.

University's Response

1. I understand that the University has appointed a Director of Student Services. When and where was this job advertised?

The Director of Student Services is a new title that has been conferred on an existing member of staff who is undertaking additional management responsibilities. This is not a new post and therefore was not advertised.

2. Since 1st October 2008, the number of people appointed to posts within the University Services with a salary greater than £60,000.

There has been one appointment since October 2008, within University Services, with a salary greater than £60,000

3. The number of current vacant posts in the University Services offering salaries of greater than £60,000.

There is currently one vacant post offering a salary greater than £60,000.

4. Since 1st October 2008, the number of University Services' staff who have resigned from posts with salaries greater than £60,000.

Two members of University Services' staff with salaries great than £60,000 have resigned from posts since 1st October 2008.
