It would not be possible to break this figure down by faith as you have asked as we simply do not hold that information. We only have information going back as far as 2002

We do not classify our compliance information in the way you have requested. The information we hold can be found in our publication *Charities Back on Track* (which is on our website at: <http://www.charitycommission.gov.uk/Library/investigations/pdfs/track.pdf>) In summary, during 2008 - 09 there were 6 statutory inquiries into charities with religion as their core purpose and 39 regulatory compliance cases, giving a total of 45 investigations for that year. In 2007 - 08 there were 14 statutory inquiries into charities with religion as their core purpose and 33 regulatory compliance cases. This gives a total of 47 investigations for that year and therefore an overall total of 92 such investigations over the two years.
