Freedom of Information

I am writing in response to your request made under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) which was received on 19 August 2009.

You asked the following:

- 1) For any documentation or information that re-invoked the cancellation of the road fund licence made by the King.**

DVLA does not hold this information.

The road fund licence was used for road expenditure by Local Authorities. There has been no direct relationship between vehicle tax and road expenditure since 1937.

- 2) How many registered vehicles are on the roads that pay tax at present?**

The information you have requested is held, but, will not be provided to you as it is reasonably accessible to you. Therefore, the information is exempt by virtue of Section 21 of the FOIA.

Your right to complain to DVLA and the Information Commissioner

You have the right to complain about the way in which your request for information was handled and/or about the decision not to disclose all or part of the information requested. In addition a complaint can be made that DVLA has not complied with its FOI publication scheme.

Your complaint will be acknowledged and you will be advised of a target date by which to expect a response. Initially your complaint will be re-considered by the official who dealt with your request for information. If, after careful consideration, that official decides that his/her decision was correct, your complaint will automatically be referred to a senior independent official who will conduct a further review. You will be advised of the outcome of your complaint and if a decision is taken to disclose information originally withheld this will be done as soon as possible.
