Please note, the University may also have indirectly received donations in addition to those figures detailed above but these are not separately identifiable. In order to make such a distinction, a review of the original source documentation would be required, this would involve a significant amount of time. Accordingly, the University has estimated that the cost of responding to your request will exceed the fee limit as set out in the Freedom of Information (Fees for Required Disclosure) (Scotland) Regulations 2004. As a result, we are not obliged to provide a response. The fee limit set down by the Regulations is £600, and in this instance this equates to a combination of staff time capped at a rate of £15 per hour. It is estimated that in order to reproduce the information requested would exceed the prescribed cost limit of £600.

Please be advised that a modified request will be given due consideration. Any modification of your request will be treated as a new request for the purposes of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

The supply of documents under the terms of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 does not give the applicant or whoever receives the information any right to re-use it in such a way that might infringe the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988 (for example, by making multiple copies, publishing or otherwise distributing the information to other individuals and the public). The Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (Consequential Modifications) Order 2004 ensured that Section 50 of the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988 ("CDPA") applies to the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 ("FOISA").
