#### REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

We refer to your e-mail dated Monday 4<sup>th</sup> January in which you state the following:

*Thank you for the survey data you released from the study you commissioned on East Marsh in 2008, and for the earlier data on Black Redstarts.*

*However, locals are aware of other activities taken on behalf of the ODA, for example the firm 'Land Use Consultants' are known to have undertaken observations in 2007 looking for kingfishers from the former access bridge to Manor Gardens Allotments and Carpenters Lock.*

*May I please re-iterate that my request was not solely for East Marsh but also for all data relating to birds for the length of the Old River Lee through the 2012 Olympics site to Old Ford Lock. I imagine given the claimed sustainability credentials of the 2012 project that more data exists and is stored in an easily retrievable form which you will be able to release.*

After making further enquiries, it has come to our attention that not all of the information specified in the description of your request was provided. Please find attached reports which relate to the following surveys:

- Waterworks Nature Reserve Sand Martin Nesting Tower monitoring survey (November 2008) – this assesses the effects of mitigation installed at the Waterworks Nature Reserve site
- Kingfisher and Sand Martin Surveys 2008 – this assesses Kingfisher and Sand Martin activity within the Olympic Park in 2008.

Under Regulation 11 you may make representations to the ODA if it appears to you that the ODA has failed to comply with a requirement of EIR in relation to this request. Representations must be made in writing to the ODA no later than 40 working days after the date on which you believe that the ODA has failed to comply. You should write to the Information Officer, Olympic Delivery Authority, One Churchill Place, Canary Wharf, London, E14 5LN. Please state detailed grounds for your complaint. The ODA shall on receipt of the representations consider them and any supporting evidence produced by you, and decide if it has complied with the requirement. The ODA shall notify you of its decision as soon as possible and no later than 40 working days after the date of receipt of the representations.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of your complaint, you may apply directly to the Information Commissioner for a decision. Generally, the Information Commissioner will not make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaint procedure provided by the ODA. You have the right to appeal to the Information Tribunal if you are not satisfied with a decision of the Information Commissioner.
