### **Reference: FOI255854**

This letter relates to your request for information of Tuesday 22nd April 2008 and which I received on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> April 2008, under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act). In that request, you asked:

***“Would you please be so kind as to inform me at what temperature the central heating is set in all government departments offices. Are there either guidelines or a maximum temperature that individual departments may set their central heating? Do the same rules apply to local government/councils etal?”***

The Cabinet Office is not in a position to respond on behalf of central and local government as each department and local authority is responsible for setting the temperature of their own cooling and heating systems. However, we suspect that this is mainly done in line with Health & Safety requirements and taking into account environmental considerations.

The temperature in Cabinet Office buildings is normally set at 23 degrees where it can be centrally controlled.
