Dear Ms Robillard

I refer to your email dated 12<sup>th</sup> July in which you requested an internal review of our response to your Freedom of Information request dated 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2010.

The role of the Children's Commissioner was created by the Children Act 2004 and is there to promote the views of children and young people from birth to 18 (up to 21 for young people in care or with learning difficulties).

I would like to confirm that we do not receive, keep or maintain any of the information you have requested.

We do not have any information regarding the number of complaints from children known to children's social care services in any capacity. If you require such information it is suggested that you contact the children's social care services department of the relevant authority.

We do not have any information relating to Cafcass or children that have been involved in the Cafcass process. If you further information on Cafcass process I would suggest you contact Cafcass.

Finally in your email dated 12<sup>th</sup> July you refer to parents being under threats from secret courts with 'no access to justice. With regard to this matter may I suggest you contact Her Majesty's Court Service (HMCS) which is an executive agency of the Ministry of Justice.
