  - *a description of each of the fields in the "Segment" dimension. That is, a description for each of the fields [list not repeated here]*
  - *a description of each of the fields in the 'Variables' dimension [list not repeated here].*
3. As advised in our letter of 9 March (our reference IRU 10/122), "field" definitions are not held in one document. In fact, not all "fields" have documented definitions. In this case, much of the information you have requested is included in our reply also sent today (our reference IRU 10/144) to your request of 16 February requesting a copy of training materials given to new Treasury staff.
4. Included in the attached files are the definitions of those "fields" not included in our earlier response, and where we have documented definitions available.
