Powers to make recommendations as to whether land acquired for an approved highway scheme is surplus to requirements.

Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and Highways Act 1980 - Powers to give consent to the seeking of an Extinguishment Order.

Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and Highways Act 1980 - Powers to recommend disposal of land, owned by the Council, which is the subject of an Extinguishment Order, to the adjoining owner.

Town and Country Planning Act 1990 - Section 247-256 - and Highways Act 1980 - Section 116 - Powers to make orders.

Highways Act 1980 - Powers to declare streets as highways maintainable at public expense, where street works have been excluded in private streets, and to publish notices in connection with adoption.

Power to make changes to the approved scale of tipping charges for trade waste and "other waste".

Power to make observations on proposals for the making or modification of Traffic Regulation Orders relating to trunk roads.

Goods Vehicles (Licensing of Operators) Act 1995 - Power to authorise lodging of objections to applications for the grant, renewal or variation of Goods Vehicle Operator's Licences.

Transport Act 1985 and Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981 Section 7 (1) - and Section 7 (14) - Power to make applications to Traffic Commissioner to determine, vary or revoke Traffic Regulation Conditions.

Transport Act 1985 and Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981 Section 7 (9) - Power to make applications to Traffic Commissioner to hold an inquiry before determining traffic regulation conditions.

Transport Act 1985 and Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981 - Power to make applications to Secretary of State for leave to seek determination, variation or revocation of Traffic Regulation Conditions on a trunk road.

Transport Act 1985 and **Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981** - Power to appeal against determination, variation or revocation of any Traffic Regulation Conditions or refusal of a Traffic Commissioner to agree such conditions.

Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981 - Section 14 - Objection to the grant of a PSV Operator's licence.

Transport Act 1985 - Section 19 - Power to issue permits of Council-owned vehicles and other vehicles (excluding vehicles used for educational and social services purposes).

Appendix 3 - Highway Management Powers

Minute 144 of the Social Services Committee on 6th May 1998 granted delegated powers by reference to a list of duties and responsibilities, shown below as Part A, and a list of some of the relevant legislation (provided by way of background information and example), shown below as part B.

Dart A

Duties And Responsibilities In Relation To Children

Without prejudice to the generality of the delegation the Director shall have the following duties and responsibilities in relation to children:

- 1. To safeguard and promote the welfare of children within the City who are "in need" and so far as is consistent with this duty, to promote the upbringing of such children by their families by providing a range and level of services appropriate to their needs.
- To provide a range of family support services as appropriate to children in need and their families, including financial assistance where this will promote the child's welfare and enable their upbringing by their family.
- 3. To take steps to prevent children suffering ill treatment or neglect and bring children before the court who are suffering or likely to suffer significant harm, where this is due to the child being beyond parental control or inadequate care.
- 4. To act as custodian of the child protection register on behalf of the Area Child Protection Committee.
- 5. To identify the extent to which children are "in need", publish information about services provided under sections 17, 18, 20 and 24 of the Children Act 1989 and take practical steps to ensure such information reaches those who may benefit from it.
- 6. To maintain a register of disabled children.
- 7. To provide appropriate accommodation and maintenance for all children being looked after.
- 8. To recruit approve train and support foster parents for children looked after, to pay all appropriate expenses including -pocket money, birthday and Christmas presents, clothing allowance, transport costs, holiday expenses, board and lodgings and any special payments considered necessary to promote and protect the welfare of individual children.
- 9. To agree financial assistance to enable visits to or by children who are being looked after, and ensure the promotion and maintenance of contact between such children and their families.
- 10. To appoint independent visitors for children being looked after as required, and where this is in their best interests and welfare.
- 11. To admit a child to secure accommodation for up to 72 hours and to make a application to court for a secure order for a child or a warrant authorising a constable to enter premises and search for a child missing from care or believed to be at risk
- 12. To provide advice and assistance (including financial assistance) for children who quality for such assistance to help them, after they have left care, to become independent and/or pursue a course of education or find employment.
- 13. To establish and maintain complaints and representation procedures for children, to identify and appoint independent persons as required, and to investigate and respond to complaints and representations.
- 14. To provide day care for children as appropriate.
- 15. To make arrangements for the provision of services by others and to promote and protect the welfare of children through voluntary organisations.
- 16. To grant or refuse permission for the marriage of any young person under the age of 18 where the Council has parental responsibility.
- 17. To register and inspect children's homes consistent with the Children Act 1989 and related guidance and regulations and to issue certificates.
- 18. To make applications for child assessment, emergency protection orders and recovery orders and to make or cause to be made such enquiries and actions considered necessary to decide what action should be taken to safeguard and promote a child's welfare.
- 19. To make ex gratia payments to foster carers in respect of claims and excess payments not exceeding £500.
- 20. To carry out the duties and responsibilities arising from adoption legislation and related guidance.
- 21. To carry out tasks specified by the Adoption Agency Regulations 1983 and the Amended Adoption Regulations 1997.
- 22. To review and approve as appropriate recommendations of the Adoption Panel.
- To approve payments for assisted adoption and assisted residence orders.
- 24. To pay legal fees in adoption cases and residence order cases in accordance with agreed policy.
- 25. To consider and manage the recoupment of costs of providing services under the Children Act 1989 part III at a level agreed by Social Services Committee.

Without prejudice to the generality of this delegation the Director of Social Services shall have the following duties and responsibilities in relation to adults and the community:

- 3. To make appropriate arrangements for the provision of a range of services for elderly and disabled people through direct provision or by contracting for care with independent organisations and to assess contributions in accordance with agreed policies and reduce or waive charges in exceptional cases.
- To authorise minor adaptations to properties up to a limit of £500.
- 5. To provide equipment for individuals under the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act.
- 6. To waive or reduce the assessed charge for community care services in exceptional cases.
- 7. To make application to court or to a magistrate for an order for the removal of a person to hospital or other suitable accommodation in circumstances where such person is unable to take proper care of themselves.
- 8. To identify and train suitable people as independent persons and to serve on appeals panels and to submit an annual list to committee
- 9. To incur expenditure on setting up expenses to enable people properly assessed to live independently in the community.
- 10. To authorise the making of liquor licence applications in respect of premises managed by the Social Services Department.
- 11. To maintain complaints and representation procedures and to investigate and respond to complaints and representations.
- 12. The power to take the responsibilities and duties under the Mental Health Act 1983 and those that remain in force under the Mental Health Act 1959, all parts, related schedules, statutory instruments, regulations and related guidance, including delegation to appropriate officers.
- 13 To receive and accept applications for guardianship orders.
- 14. To authorise approved social workers.
- 15. To make applications to the Court of Protection where a person is deemed incapable of managing their own affairs.
- The power to register, not to register or to cancel registration, to refuse consent to a person disqualified, to impose remove or vary requirements or to refuse to vary or remove requirements, to inspect and to issue appropriate notices under the Registered Homes Act 1984, Registered Homes (Amendment) Act 1991 and the Children Act 1989, including any related schedules, statutory instruments, regulations and related guidance, and including delegation to appropriate officers.
- 17. Power to impose charges and requirements of registration and guiding standards additional to those mandatory and the level of inspection, registration and advice work.
- 18. The power to authorise officers to institute conduct and defend legal proceedings on behalf of the Council in relation to any of the functions assigned to the Social Services Committee by the First Schedule of the Lorest Authority Social Services Act 1970 under the Acts listed below:
