The mayor of london has expressed grave concern over the arrest of conservative frontbencher, damian green. Boris johnson, who chairs the metropolitan police authority expressed his concerns - in trenchant terms - ahead of his arrest. A spokesman said the mayor finds it hard to believe that on the day when terrorist have gone on the rampahe in india that anti terror police in britain have apparently targeted an elected representative of parliament for no greater crime than allegedly receiving leaked documents. The mayor told the new acting commissioner of the met that he would need to see convincing evidence that this action was necesarry and proportionate. He suggested that this is not the common sense policing that people want when london faces a real potential terror threat and serious knife crime problem on the streets. Guto Harri
