[Redacted s40] and I took part in a conference call to discuss the DDR with Google, represented by [Redacted s40]. This followed up the conference call [Redacted s40] and I had with [Redacted s40] and [Redacted s40] on September 28.

- [Redacted s44]. We confirmed that we thought UK legislation permitted this [real-time dynamic auctions of spectrum access] and stressed that we would want to allow it as a matter of policy. We suggested that this might be something on which we would want to consult when designing the DDR awards early next year.
- [Redacted s44]. We confirmed that these [white spaces] were part of the DDR.
- [Redacted s44]. We indicated that we would not want to constrain their [femtocells] use so long as they complied with whatever technical conditions we settled upon. [Redacted s44].
- [Redacted s44]. We set out our criteria for licence-exemption per the LEFR.

In return:

- We asked whether the fact that UK and US cleared spectrum was not identical mattered in respect of economies of scale for handsets. [Redacted s44].
- We asked how important standardisation beyond the US was. [Redacted s44].
