Further to our earlier telephone conversation, I can confirm that the full Planning Committee date has been arranged for Tuesday 11 November 2008.

I recall your comment that GOSE may consider issuing an Article 14 direction. Just to let you know that the recommendation going before the Planning Committee is to permit the scheme but subject to the negotiation and execution of a Section 106 Agreement within six months of the decision. It is unlikely that the S.106 will be agreed and executed by 11 November and so the formal decision to grant permission (if it's approved) will not be made at that time.
