Mark - I hope you're well and enjoying the job - one of the few in London with plenty of fresh air! It's been fairly quiet on this front since we last met but it's popped up again. Could you consider the correspondence below and (yourself or a colleague) contact me please. I gather that in the Bushy Park case, the officer warned the PHV driver that he would be penalised for continuing to use the park, although a diversion round the Park would add considerably to the cost and discomfort of the disabled passenger who was in the car (who regularly uses a minicab to travel from one side of the Park to the other).

We are currently considering the issue of whether or not PHVs should be permitted to put company branding on part of the rear window or front doors. If this were permitted it

would clearly become a more difficult issue.

If you think a meeting would be helpful please let me know.

Ed,

See below re Royal Parks: the problem clearly hasn't gone away as completely as we'd hoped. I've also heard of a related problem: an administrator at Imperial College was looking to place a contract for PHV work, but firms in the Paddington/Lancaster Gate area were reluctant to bid while rules strictly forbid them using the Park as they could not risk a contract that would depend on them being able to use West Carriage Drive. So even if the Parks Police have agreed to turn blind eyes,

- (a) not all officers know of this and
- (b) the strict rules still have an effect in some circumstances.

Peter, are we still getting similar comments about Hyde Park? (and others: Regents, St James'?) We understood that, although the rules have not been changed, the police had agreed not to act against PHVs.
