Having spoken to Ms Barlow on the telephone this afternoon, it is my understanding that the organisation has been established to fundraise and purchase property for the other Narconon charities.

If an organisation is established simply to raise funds for other charities / organisations, then the trustees have no discretion as to how the funds are to be applied and consequently, the organisation will not be a charity. The reason for this is that the fundraising trustees would not be directly carrying out any charitable activity themselves. The charitable activity would be carried out by the receiving charity, whose charity trustees would have the discretion to use the funds as they see fit. The fund-raising organisation would merely be acting as a "channel" for the funds.

The purchasing of property for the other Narconon charities also does not constitute charitable activity as the charities have an implied power to do such themselves.

Finally, I would draw your attention to the fact that the entering of a charity name on the register does not give the charity which uses it any legal rights to that name. Also, whilst we will give advice about charity names which appear to be acceptable, we cannot guarantee that a name will continue to be suitable. We can direct a charity to change its name if it is the same as or similar to that of another charity or if the name is misleading or offensive.

I am writing further to correspondence between you in February 2001 regarding the charitable status of Narconon. The purpose of this letter is to advise you of the findings that have emerged from our review of the purposes and activities of that organisation.

You raised concerns with us about Narconon's links with the Church of Scientology and its drug rehabilitation programme, which utilises methods developed by L. Ron Hubbard, referring to material obtained via the Internet questioning the validity and possible dangers of those methods. We had concerns that we had not received recent accounts from the charity.

Having eventually obtained up to date accounts we met with Narconon's legal adviser and one of its trustees to determine the extent and nature of its current activities in relation to its drug rehabilitation programme (Narconon) and its programme to rehabilitate prisoners (Criminon). The accounts showed a surprisingly low level of income and expenditure (given Narconon's stated purposes) and little detail to indicate what activities were being undertaken by Narconon in furtherance of its stated purposes. This in turn raised questions about whether Narconon is undertaking its drug rehabilitation programme in the UK (and related concerns about the efficacy of that programme) and the effectiveness of the Criminon programme.

Drug rehabilitation programme

In 1995 we undertook a thorough review of Narconon and concluded that it was entitled to remain a registered charity. That review related especially to its objective to rehabilitate people who are or have been drug addicts, following concerns expressed to us about the efficacy of the treatment. We had no evidence at that stage to suggest that the programme and techniques used by Narconon in drug rehabilitation were not effective, neither did we have any proof that Narconon was being used improperly as a vehicle to recruit people as new members of Scientology. From the information supplied to us at the time we had no reason to doubt that the objects for which it was set up and the activities it carried out were charitable.



Our recent review of Narconon has revealed that much of its current activity is directed towards drug education rather than drug rehabilitation. Although the charity would like to continue its drug rehabilitation programme in the future, it is not an activity that Narconon is currently undertaking in the UK. Nevertheless, since this activity remains an aspiration for Narconon we did consider whether there are sufficient doubts as to the efficacy of that programme to justify removal of Narconon's registered charity status, such that any subsequent challenge of such a decision would not succeed.

Whilst we are aware that some concerns have been publicly expressed that the claims made for Narconon's drug rehabilitation programme are not medically established, the programme is not currently being undertaken within the UK and such opinions alone would not be sufficient for us to conclude that Narconon's purposes and activities are not charitable. You made specific reference to a report (taken from an anti-Scientology website) written by Professor Folke Sjoqvist, a clinical pharmocologist, in 1996 that the validity of the drug rehabilitation methods advocated by Narconon are unlikely to be of any value. But we have since learned that, following advice given to it by Professor Sjoqvist, the Swedish National Board of Health and Welfare went on to accept the Narconon Programme. Indeed it has been difficult to find any recent significant independent criticism of the Narconon programme. We have not received any complaints about it from anyone who has been through the programme, or knows someone who has been through it. We would therefore only be able to consider this issue on a theoretical basis and in an international context in which (as with many methods associated with L. Ron Hubbard) it difficult to obtain independent evidence. We accepted at the time of registration that Narconon's drug rehabilitation programme was a charitable activity; our review in 1995 concluded that there was no evidence to suggest that the programmes and techniques used by Narconon were not effective; the programme is not currently being undertaken in the UK and there is insufficient independent evidence available now to conclude that the programme is not effective.

We have agreed with the trustees the addition of a new object to reflect Narconon's drug education activities, which were not specifically aimed at rehabilitating drug addicts, as follows:

"To advance the education of the public and/or persons who are or have been dependent upon or affected by the use of drugs about all matters relating to drug abuse/addiction in particular by the provision of advice, information and support".

We have also accepted that there is insufficient evidence to conclude that the charity's Criminon programme, aimed at rehabilitating people convicted of crimes, does not operate for the benefit of the public. We have, though, suggested a restatement of the relevant object to more accurately reflect the nature of that activity as follows:

"To assist in the reformation and rehabilitation of persons who have at any time been convicted (whether in the United Kingdom or elsewhere) of any crime".

Our review of Narconon in 1995 also concluded that whilst the activities of Narconon provide an opportunity to draw vulnerable individuals into Scientology there was no evidence available to us to suggest that such abuse occurred. That appears to remain the position today.

Your concerns regarding Narconon's entitlement to remain on the register were largely on the grounds that its drug rehabilitation programme does not benefit the public, but we have not been able to find recent objective evidence to support that view. The drug rehabilitation programme is not currently being undertaken by Narconon within the UK. It would be difficult therefore to justify removal of the charity on the basis that that activity does not provide public benefit since it is

not currently an activity. Even if it were a current activity, there is still no clear evidence to show that it does not provide public benefit. In view of this, and unless there is anything further you wish to add by way of augmenting your concerns about the charity, it is difficult to see what other conclusion we can reach but to allow Narconon to remain on the register.

Memorandum and Articles of Association of Narconon Trust

The Companies Acts 1985 and 1989 Company Limited by Guarantee and not having a Share Capital

Memorandum of Association of Narconon Trust

- 1. The Company's name is Narconon Trust (and in this document it is called "the Charity").
- 2. The Charity's registered office is to be situate in England and Wales.
- 3. The Charity's objects ("the Objects") are:
 - (1) to reform and rehabilitate persons who are for the time being or who have at any time been drug addicts;
 - (2) to assist in the reformation and rehabilitation of persons who have at any time been convicted (whether in the United Kingdom or elsewhere) of any crime;
 - (3) to advance the education of the public and/or persons who are or have been dependent upon or affected by the use of drugs about all matters relating to drug abuse/addiction in particular by the provision of advice, information and support.
- 4. In furtherance of the Objects but not otherwise the Charity may exercise the following powers:
 - (1) to promote and encourage in such manner as the Charity shall think fit research into any matters relating to the causation prevention diagnosis or treatment of drug addiction and the dissemination of the results of any such research to the public;
 - (2) to provide funds for the setting up or support of academies, libraries, chapels, benevolent institutions, charitable institutions, schools or study centres;
 - (3) to provide funds to be utilised in the publication of books and other literature;
 - (4) to raise funds and to receive and accept contributions by way of subscription, donation, and otherwise:
 - (5) to invest monies of the Charity surplus to immediate requirements in or upon such investments, securities or property as may be thought fit but subject always to such conditions and limitations (if any) as may from time to time be imposed by law;
 - (6) to purchase, taken on lease, or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any real or personal property and any rights or privileges required for the purposes of the Charity;

- subject to such consents as may be required by law to insure, sell, let, mortgage, dispose of or turn to account all or any of the property and funds of the Charity;
- (8) subject to such consents as may be required by law to raise or borrow money for the purposes of the Charity on such terms and on such security as shall be thought fit;
- (9) to establish and support or aid in the establishment and support of any charitable association or institutions and to subscribe or guarantee money for any charitable purposes in any way connected with the object of the Charity;
- (10) to take and accept any gifts of property, whether or not subject to special trusts;
- (11) subject to clause 5 below to employ such staff, as are necessary for proper pursuit of the Objects and to make all reasonable and necessary provision for the payment of pensions and superannuation to staff and their dependants;
- (12) to establish or support any charitable trusts, associations or institutions formed for the Objects;
- (13) to co-operate with other charities, voluntary bodies and statutory authorities operating in furtherance of the Objects or similar charitable purposes and to exchange information and advice with them;
- (14) to do all such other lawful things as are necessary for the achievement of the Objects.
- 5. The income and property of the Charity shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the Objects and no part shall be paid or transferred, directly or indirectly, by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit to members of the Charity and no trustee shall be appointed to any office of the Charity paid by salary or fees or receive any remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth from the Charity; Provided that nothing in this document shall prevent any payment in good faith by the Charity:
 - (1) of the usual professional charges for business done by any trustee who is a solicitor, accountant or other person engaged in a profession, or by any partner of his or hers, when instructed by the Charity to act in a professional capacity on its behalf; Provided that at no time shall a majority of the trustees benefit under this provision and that a trustee shall withdraw from any meeting at which his or her appointment or remuneration, or that of his or her partner, is under discussion;
 - of reasonable and proper remuneration for any services rendered to the Charity by any member, officer or servant of the Charity who is not a trustee;
 - of interest on money lent by any member of the Charity or trustee at a reasonable and proper rate per annum not exceeding 2 per cent less that the published base lending rate of a clearing bank to be selected by the trustees;
 - of fees, remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth to any company of which a trustee may also be a member holding not more than 1/100th part of the issued capital of that company;

- of reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let by any member of the Charity or a trustee:
- (6) to any trustee of reasonable out-of-pocket expenses.
- 6. The liability of the members is limited.
- 7. Every member of the Charity undertakes to contribute such amount as may be required (not exceeding £10) to the Charity's assets if it should be wound up while he or she is a member or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member, for payment of the Charity's debts and liabilities contracted before he or she ceases to be a member, and of the costs charges and expenses of winding up, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributors among themselves.
- 8. If the Charity is would up or dissolved and after all its debts and liabilities have been satisfied there remains any property it shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Charity, but shall be given or transferred to some other charity or charities having objects similar to the Objects which prohibits the distribution of its or their income and property to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Charity by Clause 5 above, chosen by the members of the Charity at or before the time of dissolution and if that cannot be done then to some other charitable object.

"office" means the registered office of the Charity:

"the trustees" means the directors of the Charity (and "trustee" has a corresponding meaning);

MEMBERS

- 2. (1) The subscribers to the memorandum and such other persons or organisations as are admitted to membership in accordance with the rules made under Article 61 shall be members of the Charity. No persons shall be admitted a member of the Charity unless his application for membership is approved by the trustees.
- (2) Unless the trustees of the Charity in general meeting shall make other provision under Article 61, the trustees may in their absolute discretion permit any members of the Charity to retire, provided that after such retirement the number of members is not less than two.

GENERAL MEETINGS

- 3. The Charity shall hold an annual general meeting each year in addition to any other meetings in that year, and shall specify the meeting as such in the notices calling it; and not more than 15 months shall elapse between the date of one annual general meeting of the Charity and the next; Provided that so long as the Charity holds its first annual general meeting within 18 months of its incorporation, it need not hold it in the year of its incorporation or in the following year. The annual general meeting shall be held at such times and places as the trustees shall appoint. All general meetings other than annual general meetings shall be called extraordinary general meetings.
- 4. The trustees may call general meetings and, on the requisition of members pursuant to the provisions of the Act, shall forthwith proceed to convene an extraordinary general meeting for a date not later than eight weeks after receipt of the requisition. If there are not within the United Kingdom sufficient trustees to call a general meeting, any trustee or any member of the Charity may call a general meeting.

NOTICE OF GENERAL MEETINGS

- 5. An annual general meeting and an extraordinary general meeting called for the passing of a special resolution appointing a person as a trustee shall be called by at least 21 clear days' notice but a general meeting may be called by shorter notice if it is so agreed:
 - (1) in the case of an annual general meeting, by all the members entitled to attend and vote; and
 - (2) in the case of any other meeting by a majority together holding not less than 95 per cent. of the total voting rights at the meeting of all the members. The notice shall specify the time and place of the meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted and, in the case of an annual general meeting, shall specify the meeting as such. The notice shall be given to all the members and to the trustees and auditors.
- 6. The accidental omission to give notice of a meeting to, or the non-receipt of notice of a meeting by, any person entitled to receive notice shall not invalidate the proceedings at that meeting.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

7. No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum is present. Three persons entitled to vote upon the business to be transacted, each being a member or a duly authorised representative of a member organisation, or one-tenth of the total number of such persons for the time

being, whichever is the greater, shall constitute a quorum.

- 8. If a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, or if during a meeting a quorum ceases to be present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place or to such time and place as the trustees may determine.
- 9. The chairman, if any of the trustees or in his absence some other trustee nominated by the trustees shall preside as chairman of the meeting, but if neither the chairman nor such other trustee (if any) be present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting and willing to act, the trustees present shall elect one of their number to be chairman and if there is only one trustee present and willing to act, he shall be chairman.
- 10. If no trustee is willing to act as chairman, or if no trustee is present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting, the members present and entitled to vote shall choose one of their number to be chairman.
- 11. A trustee shall, notwithstanding that he is not a member, be entitled to attend and speak at any general meeting.
- 12. The chairman may, with the consent of a meeting at which a quorum is present (and shall if so directed by the meeting), adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at an adjourned meeting other than business which might properly have been transacted at the meeting had adjournment not taken place. When a meeting is adjourned for 14 days or more, at least seven clear days' notice shall be given specifying the time and place of the adjourned meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted. Otherwise it shall not be necessary to give any such notice.
- 13. A resolution put to the vote of a meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless before, or on the declaration of the result of, the show of hands a poll is duly demanded. Subject to the provisions of the Act, a poll may be demanded:
 - (1) by the chairman; or
 - (2) by at least two members having the right to vote at the meeting; or
 - (3) by a member or members representing not less than one-tenth of the total voting rights of all the members having the right to vote at the meeting.
- 14. Unless a poll is duly demanded a declaration by the chairman that a resolution has been carried or carried unanimously, or by a particular majority, or lost, or not carried by a particular majority and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against the resolution.
- 15. The demand for a poll may be withdrawn, before the poll is taken, but only with the consent of the chairman. The withdrawal of a demand for a poll shall not invalidate the result of a show of hands declared before the demand for the poll was made.
- 16. A poll shall be taken as the chairman directs and he may appoint scrutineers (who need not be members) and fix a time and place for declaring the results of the poll. The results of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll is demanded.

POWERS OF TRUSTEES

- 27. Subject to the provisions of the Act, the memorandum and the articles and to any directions given by special resolution, the business of the Charity shall be managed by the trustees who may exercise all the powers of the Charity. No alteration of the memorandum or the articles and no such direction shall invalidate any prior act of the trustees which would have been valid if that alteration had not been made or that direction had not been given. The powers given by this article shall not be limited by any special power given to the trustees by the articles and a meeting of trustees at which a quorum is present may exercise all the powers exercisable by the trustees.
- 28. In addition to all powers hereby expressly conferred upon them and without detracting from the generality of their powers under the articles the trustees shall have the following powers, namely:
 - (1) to expend the funds of the Charity in such a manner as they shall consider most beneficial for the achievement of the Objects and to invest in the name of the Charity such part of the funds as they may see fit and to direct the sale or transposition of any such investments and to expend the proceeds of any such sale in furtherance of the objects of the Charity;
 - (2) to enter into contracts on behalf of the Charity.

APPOINTMENT AND RETIREMENT OF TRUSTEES

- 29. At the first annual general meeting all the trustees shall retire from office, and at every subsequent annual general meeting one third of the trustees who are subject to retirement by rotation or, if their number is not three or a multiple of three, the number nearest to one third shall retire from office; but, if there is only one trustee who is subject to retirement by rotation, he shall retire.
- 30. Subject to the provisions of the Act, the trustees to retire by rotation shall be those who have been longest in office since their last appointment or reappointment, but as between persons who become or were last reappointed trustees on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot.
- 31. If the Charity at the meeting at which a trustee retires by rotation, does not fill the vacancy the retiring trustee shall, if willing to act, be deemed to have been reappointed unless at the meeting it is resolved not to fill the vacancy or unless a resolution for the reappointment of the trustee is put to the meeting and lost.
- 32. No person other than a trustee retiring by rotation shall be appointed or reappointed a trustee at any general meeting unless he is recommended by the trustees.
- 33. No persons may be appointed as a trustee:
 - (1) unless he has attained the age of 18 years: or
 - (2) in circumstances such that, had he already been a trustee, he would have been disqualified from acting under the provision of Article 38; and
 - (3) he is in good standing with Narconon International; and the trustees have received written confirmation from Narconon International that he is in good standing not more than 28 days before the appointment.

- 17. In the case of an equality of votes, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, the chairman shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any other vote he may have.
- 18. A poll demanded on the election of a chairman or on a question of adjournment shall be taken immediately. A poll demanded on any other question shall be taken either immediately or at such time and place as the chairman directs not being more than thirty days after the poll is demanded. The demand for a poll shall not prevent continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the question on which the poll is demanded. If a poll is demanded before the declaration of the result of a show of hands and the demand is duly withdrawn, the meeting shall continue as if the demand had not been made.
- 19. No notice need be given of a poll not taken immediately if the time and place at which it is to be taken are announced at the meeting at which it is demanded. In other cases at least seven clear days' notice shall be given specifying the time and place at which the poll is to be taken.

VOTES OF MEMBERS

- 20. Subject to Article 17, every member shall have one vote.
- 21. No member shall be entitled to vote at any general meeting unless all moneys then payable by him to the Charity have been paid.
- 22. No objection shall be raised to the qualification of any voter except at the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the vote objected to is tendered, and every vote not disallowed at the meeting shall be valid. Any objection made in due time shall be referred to the chairman whose decision shall be final and conclusive.
- 23. A vote given or poll demanded by the duly authorised representative of a member organisation shall be valid notwithstanding the previous determination of the authority of the person voting or demanding a poll unless notice of the determination was received by the Charity at the office before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the vote is given or the poll demanded or (in the case of a poll taken otherwise than on the same day as the meeting or adjourned meeting) the time appointed for taking the poll.
- 24. Any organisation which is a member of the Charity may by resolution of its Council or other governing body authorise such persons as it thinks fit to act as its representative at any meeting of the Charity, and the person so authorised shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of the organisation which he represents as the organisation could exercise if it were an individual member of the Charity.

TRUSTEES

- 25. The number of trustees shall be not less than three but (unless otherwise determined by ordinary resolution) shall not be subject to any maximum.
- 26. The first trustees shall be those persons named in the statement delivered pursuant to section 10(2) of the Act, who shall be deemed to have been appointed under the articles. Future trustees shall be appointed as provided subsequently in the articles.

- 34. Not less than seven nor more than 28 clear days before the date appointed for holding a general meeting notice shall be given to all persons who are entitled to receive notice of the meeting of any person (other that a trustee retiring by rotation at the meeting) who is recommended by the trustees for appointment or reappointment as a trustee at the meeting or in respect of whom notice has been duly given to the Charity of the intention to propose him at the meeting for appointment or reappointment as a trustee. The notice shall give the particulars of that person which would, if he were so appointed or reappointed, be required to be included in the Charity's register of trustees.
- 35. Subject as aforesaid, the Charity may by ordinary resolution appoint a person who is willing to act to be a trustee either to fill a vacancy or as an additional trustee and may also determine the rotation in which any additional trustees are to retire.
- 36. The trustees my appoint a person who is willing to act to be a trustee either to fill a vacancy or as an additional trustee provided that the appointment does not cause the number of trustees to exceed any number fixed by or in accordance with the articles as the maximum number of trustees. A trustee so appointed shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting and shall not be taken into account in determining the trustees who are to retire by rotation at the meeting. If not reappointed at such annual general meeting, he shall vacate office at the conclusion thereof.
- 37. Subject as aforesaid, a trustee who retires at an annual general meeting, may, if willing to act, be reappointed.

DISQUALIFICATION AND REMOVAL OF TRUSTEES

- 38. A trustee shall cease to hold office if:
 - (1) he ceases to be a trustee by virtue of any provision in the Act or is disqualified from acting as a trustee by virtue of section 72 of the Charities Act 1993 (or any statutory reenactment or modification of that provision);
 - (2) he becomes incapable by reason of mental disorder, illness or injury of managing and administering his own affairs;
 - (3) he resigns his office by notice to the Charity (but only if at least two trustees will remain in office when the notice of resignation is to take effect); or
 - (4) he is absent without permission of the trustees from all their meetings held within a period of six months and the trustees resolve that his office is vacated;
 - (5) the Charity or any trustee receives a written notice from Narconon International that he is no longer in good standing with Narconon International;
 - (6) he is removed by ordinary resolution either by the trustees, or by the members in general meeting.

TRUSTEES' EXPENSES

39. The trustees may be paid all reasonable travelling, hotel and other expenses properly incurred by them in connection with their attendance at meetings of trustees or committees of trustees or general meetings or otherwise in connection with the discharge of their duties, but shall otherwise be paid no remuneration.

TRUSTEES' APPOINTMENTS

- 40. Subject to the provisions of the Act and to Clause 5 of the memorandum, the trustees may appoint one or more of their number to the unremunerated office of managing director or to any other unremunerated executive office under the Charity. Any such appointment may be made upon such terms as the trustees determine. Any appointment of a trustee to an executive office shall terminate if he ceases to be a trustee. A managing director and a trustee holding any other executive office shall not be subject to retirement by rotation.
- 41. Except to the extend permitted by clause 5 of the memorandum, no trustee shall take or hold any interest in property belonging to the Charity or receive remuneration or be interested otherwise than as a trustee in any other contract to which the Charity is a party.

PROCEEDINGS OF TRUSTEES

- 42. Subject to the provisions of the articles, the trustees my regulate their proceedings as they think fit. A trustee may, and the secretary at the request of a trustee shall, call a meeting of the trustees. It shall not be necessary to give notice of a meeting to a trustee who is absent from the United Kingdom. Questions arising at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In the case of an equality of votes, the chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
- 43. The quorum for the transaction of the business of the trustees may be fixed by the trustees but shall not be less than one-third of their number or two trustees, whichever is the greater.
- 44. The trustees may act notwithstanding any vacancies in their number, but, if the number of trustees is less that the number fixed as the quorum, the continuing trustees or trustee may act only for the purpose of filling vacancies or of calling a general meeting.
- 45. The trustees may appoint one of their number to be the chairman of their meetings and may at any time remove him from that office. Unless he is unwilling to do so, the trustee so appointed shall preside at every meeting of trustees at which he is present. But if there is no trustee holding that office, or if the trustee holding it is unwilling to preside or is not present within five minutes after the time appointed for the meeting, the trustees present may appoint one of their number to be chairman of the meeting.
- 46. The trustees may appoint one or more sub-committees consisting of three or more trustees for the purpose of making any inquiry or supervising or performing any function or duty which in the opinion of the trustees would be more conveniently undertaken or carried out by a sub-committee: provided that all acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be fully and promptly reported to the trustees.
- 47. All acts done by a meeting of trustees, or of a committee of trustees, shall, notwithstanding that it be afterwards discovered that there was a defect in the appointment of any trustee or that any of them were disqualified from holding office, or had vacated office, or were not entitled to vote, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified and had continued to be a trustee and had been entitled to vote.
- 48. A resolution in writing, signed by all the trustees entitled to receive notice of a meeting of trustees or of a committee of trustees, shall be as valid and effective as if it had been passed at a meeting of trustees or (as the case may be) a committee of trustees duly convened and held. Such a resolution may consist of several documents in the same form, each signed by one or more of the trustees,

49. Any bank account in which any part of the assets of the Charity is deposited shall be operated by the trustees and shall indicate the name of the Charity. All cheques and orders for the payment of money from such account shall be signed by at least two persons appointed by the trustees.

SECRETARY

50. Subject to the provisions of the Act, the secretary shall be appointed by the trustees for such term, at such remuneration (if not a trustee) and upon such conditions as they may think fit: and any secretary so appointed my be removed by them.

MINUTES

- 51. The trustees shall keep minutes in books kept for the purpose:
 - (1) of all appointments of officers made by the trustees: and
 - (2) of all proceedings at meetings of the Charity and of the trustees and of committees of trustees including the names of the trustees present at each such meeting.

THE SEAL

52. The seal shall only be used by the authority of the trustees or of a committee of trustees authorised by the trustees. The trustees may determine who shall sign any instrument to which the seal is affixed and unless otherwise so determined it shall be signed by a trustee and by the secretary or by a second trustee

ACCOUNTS

- 53. (1) Accounts shall be prepared in accordance with the provisions of Part VII of the Act.
- (2) The trustees shall comply with their obligations under the Charities Act 1993 (or any statutory re-enactment or modification of that Act) with regard to:
 - (i) the keeping of accounting records for the Charity;
 - (ii) the preparation of annual statements of account for the Charity;
 - (iii) the auditing or independent examination of the statements of account of the Charity; and
 - (iv) the transmission of the statements of account of the Charity to the Commissioners.

ANNUAL REPORT

54. The trustees shall comply with their obligations under the Charities Act 1993 (or any statutory re-enactment or modification of that Act) with regard to the preparation or an annual report and its transmission to the Commissioners.

ANNUAL RETURN

55. The trustees shall comply with their obligations under the Charities Act 1993 (or any statutory

re-enactment or modification of that Act) with regard to the preparation of an annual return and its transmission to the Commissioners.

NOTICES

- Any notice to be given to or by any person pursuant to the articles shall be in writing except that a notice calling a meeting of the trustees need not be in writing.
- 57. The Charity may give any notice to a member either personally or by sending it by post in a prepaid envelope addressed to the member at his registered address or by leaving it at that address. A member whose registered address is not within the United Kingdom and who gives to the company an address within the United Kingdom at which notices may be given to him shall be entitled to have notices given to him at that address, but otherwise no such member shall be entitled to receive any notice from the Charity.
- 58. A member present in person at any meeting of the Charity shall be deemed to have receive notice of the meeting and, where necessary, of the purposes for which it was called.
- 59. Proof that an envelope containing a notice was properly addressed, prepaid and posted shall be conclusive evidence that the notice was given. A notice shall be deemed to be given at the expiration of 48 hours after the envelope containing it was posted.

INDEMNITY

60. Subject to the provisions of the Act every trustee or other officer or auditor of the Charity shall be indemnified out of the assets of the Charity against any liability incurred by him in that capacity in defending any proceedings, whether civil or criminal, in which judgment is given in his favour or in which he is acquitted or in connection with any application in which relief is granted to him by the court from liability for negligence, default, breach of duty or breach of trust in relation to the affairs of the Charity.

RULES

- 61 (1) The trustees may from time to time make such rules or bye laws as they may deem necessary or expedient or convenient for the proper conduct and management of the Charity and for the purposes of prescribing classes of and conditions of membership, and in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, they may by such rules or bye laws regulate:
 - (i) the admission and classification of members of the Charity (including the admission or organisations to membership) and the rights and privileges of such members, and the conditions of membership and the terms on which members may resign or have their membership

terminated and the entrance fees, subscriptions and other fees or payments to be made by members;

- (ii) the conduct of members of the Charity in relation to one another, and to the Charity's servants;
- (iii) the setting aside of the whole or any part or parts of the Charity's premises at any particular time or times for any particular purpose or purposes;
- (iv) the procedure at general meetings and meetings of the trustees and committees of the trustees in so far as such procedure is not regulated by the articles;
- (v) generally, all such matters as are commonly the subject matter of company rules.
- (2) The Charity in general meeting shall have power to alter, add to or repeal the rules or bye laws and the trustees shall adopt such means as they think sufficient to bring to the notice of members of the Charity all such rules or bye laws, which shall be binding on all members of the charity. Provided that no rule or bye law shall be inconsistent with, or shall affect or repeal anything contained in, the memorandum or the articles.

DISSOLUTION

62. Clause 8 of the memorandum relating to the winding up and dissolution of the Charity shall have effect as if its provisions were repeated in the articles.

I am writing with regards to the Narconon Trust Charity number 1112230. I wanted to inform you that the above named charity is in my opinion running as an insolvent company.

Narconon currently residing at 2 Albany Road, St Leonards on Sea, East Sussex, TN38 OLN, cannot pay their staff and many members of staff are currently 9 weeks behind on their wages, they cannot pay the tax and national insurance on these current wages, they also have an outstanding tax and national insurance bill from 2005/06 which they cannot afford to pay. They are also struggling to a pay the rent on the building and have been threatened with eviction if they do not meet their rent payments on time and I know for a fact that they have not met their rent payments over the last 2 weeks.

There are members of staff that are paying out of their own pocket to pay for food and vitamins, there are also a few members of staff that have paid wages out of their own saving and have not been repaid the monies owed to them from doing this.

The current executive director is not only a scientologist which the trust say they are not connected to scientology but is also from the USA and working as the executive director without a work visa although she is getting paid via Narconon international in the USA.

There seem to be a lot of things seriously wrong with this trust and I am worried for the students that they have at the centre, people are paying a lot of money for this rehabilitation centre and I feel they are being mislead. Students that leave the centre and request their money back have to wait a long time for their money. In my cased I had to wait over 12 months to get the money back that I paid out for my child and it was only when I threatened legal action that I finally got my money in instalments.

The information that I have given you above was told to me by a staff member that is currently working there and they fears that their job is at risk if I give you any names. They have lost 8 members of staff over the past couple of weeks because they have not been able to pay their wages. They also feel that the trust is at risk due to the way it is currently being run by the Executive Director from the USA.

I would like to thank you for taking the time to read this I have had to do this anonymously otherwise I can be linked to the person who gave me this information.

I introduced myself and explained that we have received a complaint that the charity may be operating whilst insolvent and wages are not being paid to employees. I also said that we have a concern as the chy is overdue its submission of AR6 and the accounts for the FYE 31/12/06.

He agreed the chy was overdue submission and he was aware of the deadline of 10 months following close of financial year. He says he has discussed this with the trustees earlier but does not known what the position is regarding the accounts. He will have to contact them to find out and said **he would get back to me by the end on the week**.

I also discussed with him the annual return advising him that this can be done on line and if he does not have a password he can go to our website in order to obtain a password.

He asked about the complaint and whether it had come from an employee. I advised him I could not reveal that information due to our policy of confidentiality. I did however advise him that the matter of the non-payment of wages is not a matter for us to be involved as it is an employment and contractual issue between the trustees and the employees which the trustees need to resolve.

Findings following desk research & searches on the internet.

Searches under the name of Narconon produced a number of websites featuring Narconon UK and Narconon International.

No information has been found on the Narconon Trust charity 1112230, the charity which is the focus of our assessment.

Narconon UK site features pictures of a large tudor style house which was first thought to be the Narconon Trust chy premises. However this seems not to be the case. Narconon UK appears to be operating the house as a drug rehab centre and the registered charity Narconon R267386 is mentioned on the website. It is the first Narconon residential centre to be opened in the UK in St Leonard's-on-Sea (2 Albany Road, St Leonard's-on-Sea, East Sussex, TN38 0LN) and was opened in 2005.

I therefore conclude this property/centre is not operated by Narconon Trust.

I have not found any mention of the name of the current Executive Director of Narconon Trust. Nor have I established who is CEO of Narconon UK/International. Therefore not been able to determine or confirm the complainant's allegation that ED of Narconon Trust is paid by or linked Narconon International.

Mr Hodkin called following my earlier message left with his office at 14:10.

He again wanted to ensure which of the three registered Narconon charities I was contacting him about. I confirmed it is the Narconon Trust 1112230. He then confirmed that this charity is not the same as the other two – Narconon R267386 and Narconon London R1098004. He also said he acts as the solicitor for all three.

In response to our discussion yesterday regarding accounts he advised me that Narconon Trust is not currently trading and the accounts are a nil balance. This I confirmed agreed with our records which confirm AR06 received in August 2007 and below threshold.

I then referred to him some of the details in the complainant's letter which I confirmed to him was anonymous. I said that the complainant has given the name of the charity as Narconon Trust and quoted Reg no 1112230. However I also quoted to him the address given by the complainant – 2 Albany Road, St. Leonards-On-Sea, East Sussex, TN38 0LN. He said these premises belong to the Narconon charity, 267386, and not the Narconon Trust.

We both concluded therefore that the complainant appears to have identified the wrong charity. I asked him if he was aware, as the solicitor for Narconon as well, of any issues concerning payments of wages to staff. He said he was not aware of any problems but the charity had recently had some reorganisation.

I advised him that in any event employment issues are not matters for us to resolve and it is a matter for the trustees and if employees have a grievance then they have recourse to the Employment Tribunal.

Having cleared up the matter and clarified our understanding I asked that he email to confirm the Narconon Trust is currently not operating and also that the premises at 2 Albany Road are operated by Narconon R267386. He agreed to do so.

Summary of findings and outcome

Anonymous complainant alleges non-payment of wages and charity operating whilst insolvent. Names charity as Narconon Trust R1112230 residing at 2 Albany Road, St Leonards-on-Sea, East Sussex, TN38 OLN.

I contacted charity correspondent to advise of complaint and request copy of accounts for FYE 31/12/06 recorded as below threshold on CDB. Also advised correspondent that issue of non-payment of wages was no a matter for us but wished to see accounts to determine if any other concerns.

Correspondent confirms charity has not yet commenced activities (registered 23/11/05) and does not operate from 2 Albany Road, St Leonards-on-Sea. Says this operating address is a drugs rehab centre for registered charity Narconon R267386. This is verified by research/checks on the internet. The correspondent is also the solicitor of Narconon Race and says he is not aware of any issues of non-payment of wages by the charity.

Conclusions

The complainant has identified the wrong charity.

There are no indications of any problems with Narconon R267386 regarding non-payment of wages and if there were it is not a matter for us to take forward.

Close case on basis that concerns raised are unfounded.

Unable to notify complainant as anonymous.

Draft of closing letter to charity.

Narconon Trust - 1112230

Thank you for your email of 9 November 2007 confirming that the Narconon Trust charity has not yet commenced activities and does not operate from 2 Albany Road, St Leonards-on-Sea.

We have completed our assessment of an anonymous complaint we have received about the Narconon Trust charity.

As we discussed in our telephone conversations the complainant names the Narconon Trust charity and quotes its registration number 1112230 and says it operates from 2 Albany Road, St Leonards-on-Sea, East Sussex, TN38 0LN. They allege that employees of the charity are not being paid and the charity is running as an insolvent company.

However from the information you have provided and our own checks it appears the complainant may have identified the wrong charity. As you confirm Narconon Trust does not operate from 2 Albany Road and is currently not operating. Checks confirm that the premises at 2 Albany Road are operated by another charity, Narconon registration number 267386. You also confirm that as the solicitor for Narconon you are not aware of any problems this charity may be experiencing in respect of non payment of employee wages. We have completed our assessment of an anonymous complaint we have received about the Narconon Trust charity

As we discussed in our telephone conversations the complainant names the Narconon Trust charity and quotes i registration number 1112230 and says it operates from 2 Albany Road, St Leonards-on-Sea, East Sussex, TN3 OLN. They allege that employees of the charity are not being paid and that the charity is running as an insolver company.

However from the information you have provided and our own checks it appears the complainant may have identifie the wrong charity. As you confirm Narconon Trust does not operate from 2 Albany Road and is currently not operating. Checks confirm that the premises at 2 Albany Road are operated by another charity, Narconon charit registration number 267386. You also confirm that as the solicitor for Narconon you are not aware of any problem this charity may be experiencing in respect of non payment of employee wages. Thank you for your recent email in which you expressed concerns about the above named charity.

As part of the assessment process, every complaint received at the Charity Commission is checked by a senior officer to determine whether it is a matter that falls within our regulatory control. If it appears to be more appropriate for some other advisory or supervisory body, such as a local authority, a government department or an organisation skilled in dispute mediation, we will normally either forward it to the relevant body or advise the person making the complaint to do so. Examples of this type of complaint are those relating to employment or contractual disputes, or between the trustees and the members of a charity.

There are also other situations in which we cannot intervene. For example, we cannot over-rule or interfere with a decision that the trustees of a charity have lawfully taken, even if it is an unpopular one.

From the information you have provided, it appears that your complaint is one in which the Commission cannot intervene in. We would suggest that you express your concerns direct to the trustees, who have wide discretion over how they manage the charity. Question: I recently acquired a Church of Scientology document, which can be downloaded here: http://wikileaks.org/wiki/Scientology_cult_Clear_Expansion_Committee_documents I've attempted attaching the individual file, but it has proved too large. It is the pdf entitled "CEC booklet, magazine". It states that Narconon's primary purpose is for CoS recruitment. It speaks of a group-wide effort to "clear the planet". Within the CoS belief system this means that they wish to clear a certain percentage of individuals worldwide, an effort that would require those people becoming members of the Church. The leaflet also states that Narconon's purpose is to "get LRH [L Ron Hubbard] tech [Scientology dogma] accepted and used as the solution to drugs". Please note the use of the definite article - not "a solution" but "the solution". Narconon's knowledge of drugs is based almost entirely on the writings of L Ron Hubbard, and much of it is contested by modern science, which it hopes to replace. Please also note that the courses that Narconon clients are on are identical to the "training routines" Scientologists undertake as they begin on their journey across the "Bridge to Total Freedom". It seems clear that Narconon exists to recruit to the Church from weak and vulnerable members of society.
