What was the total expenditure budget of the University's Careers Services (excluding operational costs such as salaries)?

I have interpreted this question as referring to the expenditure of the Careers and Employability Service. In 2017/18, the University's Careers and Employability Service's related expenditure (excluding operational costs such as salaries) was £12,061.40.

How many private ltd companies did the University's Careers Service do business with?

I am interpreting this question as referring to companies from which the Careers and Employability Service has purchased products and services. In 2017/18, the University's Careers and Employability Service purchased products and services from four private limited companies.

Approximately how much did the University's Careers Services spent on acquiring products and services from third-party private companies?

In 2017/18, the Careers and Employability Services spent £3236.81 on acquiring products and services from third-party private companies.

How much did the University's Careers Services spend on careers literature (booklets, leaflets, handouts, etc.) provided by Graduate Prospects ltd?
