### **Freedom of Information request – RFI20200414**

Thank you for your request to the BBC of 25 March 2020 seeking the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act'):

*'I am writing to request the publication of financial data about BBC Worldwide's partnership with Getty Images (<https://www.bbc.co.uk/mediacentre/worldwide/211013motiongallery>) to leverage the BBC's Motion Gallery Archive. I would like to know how much money the BBC has made out of this partnership since 1 January 2014, as well as how much money Getty Images have made. If you could provide a breakdown of the figures listing the total money made by the partnership as a whole, and how much of this has gone to Getty and how much to the BBC, I would be most appreciative'*

As set out in section 6(1)(b)(ii) of the Act, our subsidiaries (including BBC Studioworks Limited, UKTV, BBC Global News Ltd and BBC Studios Ltd), as well as the charities BBC Media Action and BBC Children in Need, are not subject to the Act. Therefore information regarding their activities is also not subject to the Act.
