The council has completed its search relating to your request about Cost of rescue from 'Irishgate' Millennium Bridge on Sunday 16/1/2022 received on Tue, 18 Jan 2022.

Request

It was reported in the 'News & Star' today that the crews from the Carlisle East Fire station were deployed in an operation at 'Irishgate' Millennium Bridge on Sunday 16/1/2022.

The Fire Service Aerial Ladder Platform (ALP) was sent to the scene as well.

Request: What is the estimated cost of such an operation?

Response

The council does hold information within the definition of your request.

The Incident required several resources that were on duty and ready to respond to emergency calls, therefore there was no additional cost associated with these assets other than fuel.

The cost incurred was reference an On-Call resource that was mobilised, the cost of this was approximately £96.40.
