The council has completed its search relating to your request about Cheviot Road, Stanwix received on Fri, 27 May 2022.

Request

County Councillor Elizabeth Mallinson recently circulated literature to residents in the Stanwix Urban Division stating the following:

“The availability of residential parking has long been an issue of concern to residents in Stanwix. I received from residents in Cheviot Road a petition requesting action to tackle parking congestion and to free up additional spaces by extending the residents only parking scheme. As the County Councillor I have raised this with the Council. Presently work is being undertaken to assess the possibility of the scheme.”

The Cheviot Road petition was worded as follows:

We the undersigned, believe that the residents of Cheviot Road should have resident parking permits and lobby the Cumbria County Council to introduce them.

No further reports or papers have been considered at Local Committee in relation to this petition. A site visit took place on Cheviot Road in 2021 and discussion had between the former Team Leader Traffic Management, at least one resident and County Councillor regarding changes to parking. Notes of this site meeting were produced and have been attached, the attachment also includes email correspondence arranging the site visit and from discussion after the site visit. Please note any changes to parking would need to undergo a Traffic Regulation Order process for changes and inclusion as part of Zone F.
