Request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the Act")

Further to your recent request for information held by King's College London, I am writing to confirm that the requested information is held by the university.

Your request

We received your information request on 16 December 2019 and have treated it as a request for information made under section 1(1) of the Act.

You requested the following information:

I am writing to you in order to make a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

I would like to know for each of the last 10 academic years (2010-11 to 2019-2020):

A) How many students in total were admitted to study the Classics BA (Greek and Latin) (Q800) and Classical Studies BA (Q810) degrees? (I.e. how many accepted their offers and started the courses)

B) How many of this total number were educated at private schools?

C) How many of this total number were educated at state schools?

If you need any clarification then please do not hesitate to contact me. Under Section 16 it is your duty to provide advice and assistance and so I would expect you to contact me if you find this request unmanageable in any way.
