Freedom of Information Act 2000

Bristol City Council has determined that your requests for information in relation to SEN (Special Educational Needs) are vexatious in accordance with section 14(1) of the act. As such, <u>Bristol City Council will not deal with any further requests from you about SEN and including previous requests we already have from you (case numbers listed below):</u>

In reaching this conclusion Bristol City Council has taken the wider context and history of previous requests into account as set out below:

- The volume and frequency of historic SEN requests indicates that your requests are obsessive in the wider context and history of the matter
- The volume and frequency of your requests is imposing a significant burden on Bristol City Council. It is apparent that any response is likely to lead to a significant number of further requests.



If you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review. <u>Internal review requests should be submitted within two months of the date of receipt of the response to your original letter and should be sent to fox@xxxxxxxx.xxx.xx.</u>

If you are still dissatisfied with the Council's response <u>after</u> the internal review you have a right of appeal to the Information Commissioner at:
