Freedom of Information Request - RFI20141687

Thank you for your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) received on 11th October, seeking the following information:

“For dates 1 April 2013 and 1 July 2014 please state:

- *how many staff were employed by News Division in each of grades 2-11, SM1 and SM2;*
- *broken down by Network News, World Service, Monitoring and English Regions, how many staff were employed on Special Personal Salaries (SPS) for each of grades 2-11, SM1 and SM2;*
- *what is the average and median salary for SPS staff at each grade;*
- *how many staff on SPS salary in each grade are above the roof of the pay range.”*

The table below shows the headcount of BBC News Division staff on permanent or fixed term contracts on 31st March 2013 and 30th June 2014. The BBC captures this information on the last day of each month, rather than the first.

The tables below show the number of BBC staff in the News Division on SPS conditions by grade at the two dates you have requested.

You will notice that under section 40(2) of the Act, we are withholding some of the information requested. As the request relates to a small number of staff, this could lead to individuals being identified. Personal information about living individuals is exempt if disclosure to a third party would breach one or more principles of the Data Protection Act 1998. As individuals who work at the BBC do not expect their employment details to be disclosed, to do so would be unfair; therefore, disclosure would breach the First Data Protection Principle, fairness.

Salaries for staff on SPS conditions are individually negotiated and as such the published roof doesn't apply. This means that the recipient has an all-inclusive salary that buys out their entitlement to other allowances. Therefore, we are not providing this information.
