Dear Mr Lidler,

Your email dated 20th July 2017 is considered to be a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You requested the following information:

I have just purchased an Ex Military Land rover and I am trying to research its Ex Military history when it was in service, its Military VRM is 64KF98, I f you could assist me with identifying and sending me any copies of any military records that you hold for this vehicle

I can confirm that the Ministry of Defence (MOD) holds information relevant to your request. Unfortunately, following the closure of MERLIN it is only possible to retrieve information held on the archived version of the database, which is attached.

This information supplied to you continues to be protected by copyright. You are free to use it for your own purposes, including for private study and non-commercial research, and for any other purpose authorised by an exception in current copyright law. Documents (except photographs) can be also used in the UK without requiring permission for the purposes of news reporting. Any other reuse, for example commercial publication, would require the permission of the copyright holder.

Most documents supplied will have been produced within government and will be Crown Copyright. Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review
