## Freedom of Information Act 2000 - 4102916

Thank you for your request for information, which we received on 4 March 2019 and processed under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Your request was:

- "1. To date how many applications have been registered on the Homes England's IT system?
- 2. To date how many applications have had their application cancelled?
- 3. Is there a date that all URN/applications must be registered into the Homes England's IT system by the housing association?".

I can confirm that the information requested is held by the Ministry of Housing, Communities & Local Government and we are able to provide you with all this information. I have detailed below the information that is being released to you.

The most recent data available from Homes England relates to 4 March 2019. As of that date, 3,580 applications had been entered on the Homes England information management system. The total number of applications is subject to change as applications are still being input.

As of 4 March, of the tenants who have made an application to their housing association (where this data has been supplied to us by providers), 546 have either cancelled their application, or else their application had been terminated by their housing association. Reasons for termination may include a tenant not meeting the eligibility criteria for the pilot, or a tenant withdrawing their application for any reason, for example if they cannot afford the purchase.

There is no cut-off date for applications to be registered on the system, but we encourage housing associations to enter the data they have as quickly as possible, to provide an accurate representation of take-up of the Midlands pilot and the speed of purchases.
