Thank you for your request for information made under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000, relating to Cleve Hill. Please see the response provided below:

You asked for full details of all impact assessments, health and safety assessments, risk assessments and any other assessments undertaken by Cleve Hill Solar Limited in connection with their Construction Traffic Management Plan, which were provided to Kent County Council for review.

Assessments associated with the above request were not provided directly to Kent County Council for review and were instead made available to consultees and any other interested parties to access via either the Applicant's own website or through the Planning Inspectorate's portal.
