5G Trial of Traffic Monitoring Sensors

The details we require are:

- Suppliers who applied for inclusion on each framework/contract and were successful & not successful at the PQQ & ITT stages
- Actual contract values of each framework/contract (& any sub lots)
- Start date & duration of framework
- Is there an extension clause in the framework(s)/contract(s) and, if so, the duration of the extension?
- Has a decision been made yet on whether the framework(s)/contract(s) are being either extended or renewed?
- Who is the senior officer (outside of procurement) responsible for this contract?

Response

The contract for the '5G Trial of Traffic Monitoring Sensors' was awarded to 'Vivacity Labs Ltd'.

As the 5G trial was a direct award in accordance with the Council's Procurement Procedure Rules no other suppliers were invited to bid for this contract.
