Freedom of Information Request - RFI20191625

Thank you for your request to the BBC of 8 October 2019 seeking the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act'):

Can you please let me know the total amount spent by the BBC on biscuits for the past two years.

Could you also please provide details of the most popular biscuits bought in by the BBC and amount spent per type of biscuit.

Also could you let me know how many toilet rolls the BBC has purchased for the same time period

Under section 1(1) of the Act, we can confirm that the BBC does not hold this information. With regards to Part 3 of your request, please be aware that toilet rolls are included in the contractor's unitary charge to the BBC. An amount is charged per building per month and it is not possible to split this out to capture amount attributable to toilet rolls.

Appeal Rights

If you are not satisfied that we have complied with the Act in responding to your request, you have the right to an internal review by a BBC senior manager or legal adviser. Please contact us at the address above, explaining what you would like us to review and including your reference number. A request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of receiving the BBC's response to your original request.
