Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Request – 200319002

Thank you for your request received by MoJ 19 March 2020, in which you asked for the following information from the Ministry of Justice (MoJ):

“Could you please inform me how many members of parliament attended the 24-27/02/2020 Extradition Court Hearing at Belmarsh Magistrates Court operating from inside Woolwich Crown Court for US vs Julian Assange and from which country.”

Your request has been handled under the FOIA.

The MoJ does not hold any information in the scope of your request. This is because there is no legal or business requirement for MoJ to do so. The court allocated 10 tickets each day for Members of the European Parliament, the court does not hold the information of who actually attended or if all the ticket allocation was taken on each day.

The FOIA does not oblige a public authority to create information to answer a request if the requested information is not held. The duty is to only provide the recorded information held.

Appeal Rights

If you are not satisfied with this response you have the right to request an internal review by responding in writing to one of the addresses below within two months of the date of this response.
