Your request has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Dear HM Passport Office,

I would like to request the following information

- The current number of valid British National (Overseas) passports

Her Majesty's Passport Office can confirm the total number of British National (Overseas) passports that currently are in circulation as of 26 June 2020 is 363,099.


- The number of BN(O) passport applications processed since June 2019

Her Majesty's Passport Office can confirm the total number of British National (Overseas) passports that have been processed from 1 June 2019 to 30 June 2020 is 198,274.

- The number of persons eligible to renew/apply for a BN(O) passport

If you were to remain dissatisfied after an internal review, you would have a right of complaint to the Information Commissioner as established by section 50 of the FOIA.
