Dear Mr Morgan,

Thank you for your email of November 9th requesting the following information:

"Dear Royal Air Force,

I wish to ask under the Freedom of Information Act, what happened to the wreckage of Lightning XS894 which was lost on the 8th of September 1970. The accident card in the RAF Museum archives state that it was a Cat. 5 right-off, while the RAF Aircraft Accident Report from June 1972 makes no mention of what happened to the aircraft. I was wondering where and when it was sent for scraping and recovery of useful spare parts? Please can you advise me regarding this issue. I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)."

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that no information in scope of your request is held.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to note that any information of that age that has survived will be held at The National Archives.
