## **Freedom of Information Request**

Freedom of Information Request: Subway Station Usage Statistics

Your request dated 16 July 2022 for information in relation to the above has been considered under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 ("FOISA").

You have requested that Strathclyde Partnership for Transport ("SPT") provides you with the following information:

"For each of the following twelve periods below can you please give me the annual station usage statistics for each station on your Glasgow Subway network.

- 01/01/2010 to 31/12/2010
- 01/01/2011 to 31/12/2011
- 01/01/2012 to 31/12/2012
- 01/01/2013 to 31/12/2013
- 01/01/2014 to 31/12/2014
- 01/01/2015 to 31/12/2015
- 01/01/2016 to 31/12/2016
- 01/01/2017 to 31/12/2017
- 01/01/2018 to 31/12/2018
- 01/01/2019 to 31/12/201901/01/2020 to 31/12/2020
- 01/01/2021 to 31/12/2021

So for each period i need the statistics broken down by station (so the total amount of entries and exits for each station) so that i can see what usage that each station has received.

If for any reason you are unable to provide me with all of these periods than please just provide me with what you are able to."

I attach a table providing the information held by SPT relating to Subway patronage (gate entries) covered by your request, and trust that this is of assistance to you.

SPT does not hold information on gate exits for patronage, as we are unable to filter this information in the way we have for gate entries.
