## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2002, I would like to request data regarding the number of motorists issued Fixed Penalty Notices for vehicle modifications that are in violation of The Road Vehicles legislation.

Can I please receive each total individually for the time period of 01/04/2019 - 31/03/2020. Could this be specific to those recorded within the boundaries of Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh and Glasgow individually.

Can I please receive a total count of FPNs issued to motorists for driving vehicles that violate the following regulations:

- License Plate The Road Vehicles (Display of Registration Marks) Regulations 2001, Regulations 5 & 6 http://www.legislation.gov.uk/uksi/2001/561/contents
- 4. Tinted Windows The Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986, Regulation 32, Paragraph 10 <a href="http://www.legislation.gov.uk/uksi/1986/1078/regulation/32/made">http://www.legislation.gov.uk/uksi/1986/1078/regulation/32/made</a>

In response to your request, I regret to inform you that I am unable to provide you with the information you have requested, as it would prove too costly to do so within the context of the fee regulations.

As you may be aware the current cost threshold is £600 and I estimate that it would cost well in excess of this amount to process your request.

As such, and in terms of Section 16(4) of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 where Section 12(1) of the Act (Excessive Cost of Compliance) has been applied, this represents a refusal notice for the information sought

By way of explanation, crimes in Scotland are recorded in accordance with the Scottish Government Justice Department offence classification codes and are not thereafter subcategorised.

In this instance, the relevant offences are as follows:-

- 318/000 Registration or Identification mark offences (not lighting)
- 319/000 Lighting Offences, motor vehicle
- 320/000 Construction and use regulations (other than lighting)

The below table provides the number of FPNs issued to motorists for violating the above regulations, broken down by council area, for the financial year 2019/20.

All statistics are provisional and should be treated as management information. All data have been extracted from Police Scotland internal systems and are correct as at 29/6/2020.

1. The data was extracted using the crime's raised date and by using SGJD codes 732000, 731900 and 731800.

Unfortunately, the only way to ascertain what each offence was specifically related to, i.e. tinted windows, exhaust etc. would be to individually examine each of the above offences.

This is an exercise which I estimate would far exceed the cost limit set out in the Fees Regulations.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
