We should have info on subspecies, although the *Bengalensis* is an Annex B species so would not require Article 10 certificates.

With regards to imports, I should add that before the new EC Regulations were introduced in 1997, we were required to issue certificates for the movement of specimens between EU Member States. However, this would be outside the 10 year period you are interested in. You should also be aware, that there could be Eagle owls in the UK that have come from other EU Member States and which are legally being used commercially under cover of Article 10 certificates issued by another EU Member State - the Regulations can get complicated at time! Also, I don't think Norway is an EU Member State!

I will ask one of my team to gather the information you have asked for and send it to you; but it might take a short while to pull this all together.
