## Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 Our Ref: 364-20

I refer to your enquiry dated 2 November 2020 asking to be supplied with the following information under the provisions of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 ("the FOISA"):

• A breakdown of the number of returning students applying for each different accommodation option offered by the University (individual halls and accommodation types within those halls etc.) in academic year 2020/21, alongside the number of spaces available for returners for each such option.

## Your right to seek a review of how your information request was managed

If you remain dissatisfied with how your request for information has been dealt with following Review, you also have the right to apply to the Scottish Information Commissioner (SIC) for a decision. In the event of an appeal to the SIC, the Commissioner will generally only be able to investigate the matters raised in the request for review.
