Freedom of Information Request Reference FOI-1385606

Thank you for your request dated 19 January 2022, in which you asked the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC):

“As a follow up can you tell me whether this applies to Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland or if it is a devolved issue?”

If it is a devolved issue, can you tell me which are the appropriate departments which it is devolved to?”

This was a follow-up to your previous request of 13 December 2021, to which we responded on 13 January 2022 (our ref: FOI-1379405) in which you asked:

“Dear Department of Health and Social Care,

Please give the formula that is used which takes ACE scores into account, when deciding the capacity of a mother to look after her children or removal of those children.

ACE scores - Adverse Childhood Experience Scores”

Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

DHSC holds the information you have requested.
