Dear R Stokes,

Your request was received on 19 July 2022 and I am dealing with it under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act').

You asked:

I would like to know the following information for the A100 Undergraduate medical course for the 2021/22 admissions cycles. If this cannot be provided for this admission cycle, we would be grateful if it could be provided on the 2020/2021 admission cycle instead. I would be grateful if all of this information could be provided on a college basis, rather than the university as a whole: -

The number of successful private school applicants The number of successful state school applicants per college.

The number of successful applicants with 4+ A levels (not including EPQ)

The requested information is attached. Some suppression has been applied to prevent the risk of any individual being identified. In presenting the information in this way, the University is engaging the exemption at section 40(3A)(a) of the Act because the release of the raw data would breach the first data protection principle (the fair, lawful and transparent processing of personal data) as set out in the UK General Data Protection Regulation. This part of section 40 confers absolute exemption under the Act.
