Thank you for your response to request 58424.
In response to request 56603, I was told "API data is held for 10 years. We are unable to provide information on the deletion process as there is a Home Office moratorium preventing the destruction of Information."

Please clarify whether the date of the oldest API record as of March 2020--25th June 2013--is for all records, including those subject to further access controls. Does this also mean that the moratorium--placed in 2015--does not apply to API data as implied in the previous response? I am assuming that when the moratorium was placed, there should have been data going back at least five years at the time (there should have been records from 2010 in 2015).
