Dear Mr John Jones,

Thank you for your email dated 8th October 2018 requesting information on 'Are Service Users or the general public allowed to audio-visually record meeting & calls with staff'.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Guidance from the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) states that a valid request "must be in writing; include the requester's name and an address for correspondence; and, describes the information requested"

The ICO states that "the intention of the legislation is for the requester to provide their real name", and that "the absence of a real name would make it technically invalid under Section 8(1)(b)" of the FOIA.

It should be noted, if an invalid request is processed by a Public Authority, the requester would have no recourse to the ICO as their powers only extend to valid requests under section 8 of the Act.

In view of the above and as the MOD has reason to believe that your request may be invalid, please would you provide us with identification, in the form of a copy of your driving licence or passport.
