Dear Ms Campbell Jack,

Thank you for your email of 2 June in which you requested the following information:

*I request to be given the following information on armed forces visits to state primary schools in Scotland between 2010-15 including; the name and address of the school; the date of the visit or visits; the amount and rank of personnel visiting; the subjects under discussion (please specify), and physical activity with pupils during the visit (please specify); the number of classes and years involved in the visit or visits; the job title of the person initiating the visit.*

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). The Armed Forces do undertake visits to many state and private schools across the UK, but only at the specific invitation of the schools and colleges themselves. The purpose of these visits, agreed with the schools beforehand, range from raising awareness of the Armed Forces and their place in a democratic society, to practical sessions (aligned with the National Curriculum) designed to enhance teamwork, communications and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) skills, as well as building interest in the Services.

A search for the information has now been completed, and I can confirm that the Ministry of Defence holds some information within scope of your request, presented in the tables below, broken down by Service.

## **ROYAL NAVY**

The Royal Navy does not hold details of the individuals that issued the invitation, and since 2012, does not hold information of visits by its personnel to primary schools in Scotland.
