Between 2013-15, Wired Sussex ran 2 pilot programmes that integrated artists and arts practices with technology start-up models to support innovators in the creation of new, value-generating businesses.

We therefore have the resources and expertise available to significantly expand on those pilots through this programme. We can create collaborative and peer-driven learning environments, have a set of core learning tools, a group of mentors, curators and experts from the start-up and arts sectors, and a space designed to support this type of programme.

Brighton's high rate of start-ups and strong creative and technology sectors makes it an attractive location for participants. Wired Sussex has a substantial network of individuals, organisations and businesses to support any call. The track record of our pilot projects will also enhance response rates. We are confident we can rapidly attract a suitably diverse cohort.

The Fuse research empirically demonstrated the importance of artistic practices in the innovation and value creation process. The opportunity is to cultivate integrated arts practices, to create coherent, scalable and replicable models that enable ideas to become innovations and grow beyond the micro stage, and to support the UK's strategic advantage in the Creative Industries.

Wired Sussex has a recognised track record in connecting arts and technology. We are a lead partner in the influential Fuse projects, created the hybrid arts / technology space 'The FuseBox' and re-orientated Brighton Digital Festival (which we manage) on a fused model.

We have robust systems in place to receive grant funds. Recent examples include the Recreate EU programme for creative industry hubs and the ACE-supported Brighton Digital Festival. We act as grants administrators for Brighton Digital Festival (overseeing commissions) and the RGF-supported Intern Placement Programme, which provides over 100 grants to CI SME's.
