Dear Michael John

Thank you for your email of 20 December 2018 in which you ask the following under the Freedom of Information Act ('Fol Act'):

'... what peice of law or legislation sates that i am required to perform /hold fiduciary obligation to a person that has never been born and created by the crown corparation around the same time i was born ??'

Your email does not appear to be seeking access to recorded information that the Bank of England (the 'Bank') may hold but appears to be asking a question. Please be aware that the Fol Act provides a general right of access to recorded information held by a public authority, subject to certain exemptions and procedural requirements but it does not require a public authority to answer questions.

Your right to complain under the Fol Act

If you are unhappy with the Bank's response, you may ask for that decision to be reviewed internally.
