THE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF BARNSLEY (WAKEFIELD ROAD (A61) BARNSLEY) (QUALITY BUS CORRIDOR PHASE 3) (CLASSIFIED ROAD) (SIDE ROADS) ORDER 2009

The Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council make this Order in exercise of their powers under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf:-

- The Council are authorised in relation to the classified road in the districts of Monk Bretton and Barnsley in the Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley in the County of South Yorkshire to:-
 - (a) improve the lengths of highways named in the Schedule to this Order along the length of those highways shown on the Site Plan by crosshatching (such hatching showing the realigned position of those highways where realignment is involved);
 - (b) stop up each length of highway described in the said Schedule and shown on the Site Plan by zebra hatching;
 - (c) construct new highways along the routes described in the said

 Schedule and shown on the Site Plan by stipple (the centre line of each new highway being shown by an unbroken black line on the plan);
 - (d) stop up each private means of access to premises described in the said Schedule and shown on the Site Plan by a solid black band; and

- (e) provide new means of access to premises along the routes and at the locations described in the said Schedule and shown on the Site Plan by thin diagonal hatching
- 2. Each item described in the said Schedule as aforesaid is given a reference number which also appears on the Site Plan
- 3. Where a new highway is to be constructed wholly or partly along the same route as a new access or part of one that new highway shall be created subject to the private rights over that new access
- 4. Where immediately before a length of highway is stopped up in pursuance of this Order there is under in on over along or across that highway any apparatus of statutory undertakers or any telecommunications code system operator then subject to section 21 of the Highways Act 1980 those undertakers or that operator as the case may be shall have the same rights as respects that apparatus as they had immediately before the stopping up took place

5. In this Order:-

- (a) all distances are measured along the centre line of the relevant highway or private means of access to premises as the case may be; and
- (b) "the classified road" means the highway which the Council proposes to construct from a point on Burton Road 260 metres south east of its junction with Wakefield Road and Old Mill Lane (A61) Barnsley generally south westwards then generally north westwards to a point on Old Mill Lane (A61) 178 metres south of its junction with Burton Road Monk Bretton in the Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley which is a

highway which is a classified road in accordance with section 12 of the Highways Act 1980

"the Council" means the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council
"the Site Plan" means the drawing numbered HD/A61.68.3/SRO1 and
marked "The Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley (Wakefield Road
(A61) Barnsley) (Quality Bus Corridor Phase 3) (Classified Road) (Side
Roads) Order 2009" sealed with the common seal of the Council and
deposited at the offices of the Council at The Barnsley Connects Service

Lane, Monk Bretton, Barnsley A certified copy is also deposited at the
Offices of the Secretary of State for Transport

"premises" includes land

"improvement" in relation to a highway includes raising lowering or otherwise altering that highway and "improved" shall be construed accordingly

"new access" means a means of access to premises authorised by this Order to be provided

"new highway" means a highway authorised by this Order to be constructed and "new highways" shall be constructed accordingly
