Freedom of Information Request - RFI20201730

Thank you for your request to the BBC of 05 November 2020 seeking the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act'):

I have a TV license and a portable device, please confirm anywhere that it is not permissible to watch iPlayer on a portable device under your user regulations.

Due to rights agreements, you need to be in the UK to stream and download programmes or watch BBC TV channels on BBC iPlayer, meaning that you are not able to use iPlayer when outside of the UK. Further information can be found here:
