A. this is about preventing crews from having to clean vehicles, they should be performing their skills not scrubbing Ambulances, this should be done by a professional team in a specific hub.

- A. The shift duraction will be the same due to the hubs being sited near to acute hospitals, however this is about increasing crew availability at shift start and finish times by having more available vehicles, therefore end of shift overtime should reduce.
- Q. Will the board support the views of the public or have they made up their minds?
- Q. Have we considered co-locating with the fire service to increase hubs but reduce costs?
- Q. Will the sale of the land be dealt with by professional agents
- Q. Why are all of the meetings during the day, we should have them at night when people are able t00 attend.
