Thank you for your email of 6 August where you requested the following information:

Please can you provide a list of the of the current Advisers to the Board of Trade and their dates of appointment.

Please can you provide a list of any previous Advisers to the Board of Trade, the dates of their appointments and the dates they vacated the position.

A list was previously published on the Board of Trade Website on the .gov.uk website, please can you explain why this information is no longer published, including if any consideration was given to any best practice regarding Government Transparency

Please can you provide information on the decision making process for who is appointed to the Board of Trade, and the Person/Persons responsible for making such a decision

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act'), you have the right to:

- know whether we hold the information you require
- be provided with that information (subject to any exemptions under the Act which may apply).

The Department for International Trade does not hold any information pertaining to a current list of advisers to the UK Board of Trade, and their dates of appointment, as this information is yet to be determined. Once the department holds this information it will be published on the UK Board of Trade website on www.gov.uk.

A previous list of advisors (please see below) published on the UK Board of Trade website has since been removed, as the Board in its previous form has been stood down. The Department for

International Trade is committed to government transparency. The decision to remove the previous list of advisers is to ensure all published information is accurate.

The UK Board of Trade is appointed by a process known as Direct Ministerial Appointment and follows Cabinet Office Propriety & Ethics guidelines on these appointments. This means that individuals are appointed at the discretion of the Secretary of State. The roles are taken on a voluntary basis and are not remunerated.
