I am writing regarding your request for information received 7 July 2014. Your request has been considered under the *Environmental Information Regulations (EIR)* 2004.

In your request you have stated:

When deciding to have a bored tunnel through the Chilterns from the M₂₅ to Mantles Wood you must have measured the benefits of a bored tunnel against the cost of a surface line. Please send me full details and costs of those benefits.

The benefits of the Chilterns bored tunnels were explored in the reports produced in January 2012, after the route consultation for Phase One. I have provided links to these below. All costs are included in those reports, we do not have any further information on benefits (or the cost of those benefits) specific to a bored tunnel through the Chilterns.

Your right to complain to HS2 Ltd and the Information Commissioner

You have the right to complain to HS₂ Ltd within two calendar months of the date of this letter about the way in which your request for information was handled and/or about the decision not to disclose all or part of the information requested.

Your complaint will be acknowledged and you will be advised of a target date by which to expect a response. Initially your complaint will be re-considered by the official who dealt with your request for information. If, after careful consideration, that official decides that his/her decision was correct, your complaint will automatically be referred to a senior independent official who will conduct a further review. You will be advised of the outcome of your complaint and if a decision is taken to disclose information originally withheld this will be done as soon as possible.
