

  - (d) to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road; to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, the side of road or the length of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said road, the

said side of road or the said length of road of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984:

 to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

(f) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said road, the said side of road or the said length of road.

- 5. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to permit or cause any disabled person's vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for a period of not more than three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day) providing there is displayed on the vehicle in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver has marked the time at which the period of waiting began).
- Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any disabled person's vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in those Articles for a long as may be necessary providing there is displayed on the vehicle in the relevant position a disabled person's badge.
- 7. The restrictions imposed by Articles 1, 2 and 3 of this Order shall Not apply to the following vehicles:

Hackney carriages while waiting at a duly authorised cab rank

Pedal cycles while parked in a duly authorised cycle parking Facility, the location of which has been approved by the Highway Authority and the Chief Officer of Police.

- 8. The Order specified in Schedule 4 to this Order is hereby revoked.
- 9. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This Order shall come into operation on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2005, and may be cited as "The City of Chester (City Road)(Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2005.
