BOROUGH OF LOWESTOFT

BYE-LAWS

made on the 12thday of December 1951 by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Lowestoft acting by the Council under Section 164 of the Public Health Act, 1875,

for regulating

The Flying of Power-Driven Model Aircraft

in certain of the pleasure grounds within the said Borough.

- 1. In these Byelaws the expression "the Council" means the Council of the Borough of Lowestoft in the County of Suffolk and the expression "power-driven model aircraft" means any model aircraft driven by the combustion of petrol-vapour or other combustible substances.
- 2. A person shall not fly any power-driven model aircraft in any of the three pleasure grounds known respectively as Nicholas Everitt Park, Kensington Gardens and Kirkley Fen.

- 3. Where any part of the pleasure ground known as Normanston Park has, by a notice conspicuously exhibited in the said pleasure ground, been set apart by the Council for the flying of power-driven model aircraft a person shall not fly or permit any such model aircraft to fly in any other part of the said pleasure ground.
- 4. Every person who offends against any of these byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two pounds.
- 5. Every person who infringes any of the foregoing byelaws may be removed from the pleasure ground in question by any officer of the Council, or by any constable, in any one of the several cases hereinafter specified; that is to say—
 - (i) where the infraction of the byelaw is committed within the view of the officer or constable, and the name and residence of the person infringing the byelaw are unknown to and cannot be readily ascertained by the officer or constable;
 - (ii) where the infraction of the byelaw is committed within the view of the officer or constable, and, from the nature of the infraction, or from any other fact of which the officer or constable may have knowledge, or of which he may be credibly informed, there may be reasonable ground for belief that the continuance in the pleasure ground in question of the person infringing the byelaw may result in another infraction of a byelaw, or that the removal of the person from the pleasure ground in question is otherwise necessary as a security for the proper use and regulation thereof.
