I am fully aware that DWP notify all benefit claimants and pensioners of changes in payments in case of budget changes, changes in law etc., but can you please specify what rule/law this is?

## **DWP Response**

Regulation 28 of the Social Security and Child Support (Decisions and Appeals) Regulations 1999, provides that the Secretary of State must give a written decision notice where the decision made is appealable.

The equivalent regulation for Personal Independence Payment (PIP) and Universal Credit (UC), is regulation 51 of the UC, PIP, JSA and ESA (Decisions and Appeals) Regulations 2013.

Although such decisions are not appealable, written notice (without appeal rights) is also given when benefits are uprated in April of each year. And written notices are issued as a matter of routine when other non-appealable decisions are made.

The legislation which covers changes to the benefits themselves – and which need to be notified as above - can be found in the <u>Social Security Administration Act 1992</u>, sections 150 – 160B.
