It is recognised there may be a risk that someone may be admitted into a care home due to rapid deterioration which will mean the address on the DNACPR needs to be updated and it is good practice to ensure that the DNACPR is updated promptly. However, if there is insufficient time the DNACPR that has been transferred with the patient can be used and the reason for the address discrepancy explained to NWAS.
